

DAY TWO**Genesis 49:5-7**

- 5 "Simeon and Levi are brothers;
 Their swords are implements of violence.
- 6 "Let my soul not enter into their council;
 Let not my glory be united with their assembly;
 Because in their anger they slew men,
 And in their self-will they lamed oxen.
- 7 "Cursed be their anger, for it is fierce;
 And their wrath, for it is cruel.
 I will disperse them in Jacob,
 And scatter them in Israel.

DAY THREE**Genesis 28:11-22**

- 11 He came to a certain place and spent the night there, because the sun had set; and he took one of the stones of the place and put it under his head, and lay down in that place.
- 12 He had a dream, and behold, a ladder was set on the earth with its top reaching to heaven; and behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it.
- 13 And behold, the LORD stood above it and said, "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie, I will give it to you and to your descendants.
- 14 "Your descendants will also be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and in you and in your descendants shall all the families of the earth be blessed.
- 15 "Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you."
- 16 Then Jacob awoke from his sleep and said, "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I did not know it."
- 17 He was afraid and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven."
- 18 So Jacob rose early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put under his head and set it up as a pillar and poured oil on its top.
- 19 He called the name of that place Bethel; however, previously the name of the city had been Luz.
- 20 Then Jacob made a vow, saying, "If God will be with me and will keep me on this journey that I take, and will give me food to eat and garments to wear,
- 21 and I return to my father's house in safety, then the LORD will be my God.
- 22 "This stone, which I have set up as a pillar, will be God's house, and of all that You give me I will surely give a tenth to You."

DAY FOUR**Exodus 17:8-16**

- 8 Then Amalek came and fought against Israel at Rephidim.
- 9 So Moses said to Joshua, "Choose men for us and go out, fight against Amalek. Tomorrow I will station myself on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand."
- 10 Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought against Amalek; and Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill.

- 11 So it came about when Moses held his hand up, that Israel prevailed, and when he let his hand down, Amalek prevailed.
- 12 But Moses' hands were heavy. Then they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it; and Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other. Thus his hands were steady until the sun set.
- 13 So Joshua overwhelmed Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.
- 14 Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write this in a book as a memorial and recite it to Joshua, that I will utterly blot out the memory of Amalek from under heaven."
- 15 Moses built an altar and named it The LORD is My Banner;
- 16 and he said, "The LORD has sworn; the LORD will have war against Amalek from generation to generation."

Numbers 13:25-30

- 25 When they returned from spying out the land, at the end of forty days,
- 26 they proceeded to come to Moses and Aaron and to all the congregation of the sons of Israel in the wilderness of Paran, at Kadesh; and they brought back word to them and to all the congregation and showed them the fruit of the land.
- 27 Thus they told him, and said, "We went in to the land where you sent us; and it certainly does flow with milk and honey, and this is its fruit.
- 28 "Nevertheless, the people who live in the land are strong, and the cities are fortified *and* very large; and moreover, we saw the descendants of Anak there.
- 29 "Amalek is living in the land of the Negev and the Hittites and the Jebusites and the Amorites are living in the hill country, and the Canaanites are living by the sea and by the side of the Jordan."
- 30 Then Caleb quieted the people before Moses and said, "We should by all means go up and take possession of it, for we will surely overcome it."

Deuteronomy 25:17-19

- 17 "Remember what Amalek did to you along the way when you came out from Egypt,
- 18 how he met you along the way and attacked among you all the stragglers at your rear when you were faint and weary; and he did not fear God.
- 19 "Therefore it shall come about when the LORD your God has given you rest from all your surrounding enemies, in the land which the LORD your God gives you as an inheritance to possess, you shall blot out the memory of Amalek from under heaven; you must not forget.

1 Samuel 15:1-20

- 1 Then Samuel said to Saul, "The LORD sent me to anoint you as king over His people, over Israel; now therefore, listen to the words of the LORD.
- 2 "Thus says the LORD of hosts, 'I will punish Amalek *for* what he did to Israel, how he set himself against him on the way while he was coming up from Egypt.
- 3 'Now go and strike Amalek and utterly destroy all that he has, and do not spare him; but put to death both man and woman, child and infant, ox and sheep, camel and donkey.' "
- 4 Then Saul summoned the people and numbered them in Telaim, 200,000 foot soldiers and 10,000 men of Judah.
- 5 Saul came to the city of Amalek and set an ambush in the valley.
- 6 Saul said to the Kenites, "Go, depart, go down from among the Amalekites, so that I do not destroy you with them; for you showed kindness to all the sons of Israel when they came up from Egypt." So the Kenites departed from among the Amalekites.
- 7 So Saul defeated the Amalekites, from Havilah as you go to Shur, which is east of Egypt.

- 8 He captured Agag the king of the Amalekites alive, and utterly destroyed all the people with the edge of the sword.
- 9 But Saul and the people spared Agag and the best of the sheep, the oxen, the fatlings, the lambs, and all that was good, and were not willing to destroy them utterly; but everything despised and worthless, that they utterly destroyed.
- 10 Then the word of the LORD came to Samuel, saying,
- 11 “I regret that I have made Saul king, for he has turned back from following Me and has not carried out My commands.” And Samuel was distressed and cried out to the LORD all night.
- 12 Samuel rose early in the morning to meet Saul; and it was told Samuel, saying, “Saul came to Carmel, and behold, he set up a monument for himself, then turned and proceeded on down to Gilgal.”
- 13 Samuel came to Saul, and Saul said to him, “Blessed are you of the LORD! I have carried out the command of the LORD.”
- 14 But Samuel said, “What then is this bleating of the sheep in my ears, and the lowing of the oxen which I hear?”
- 15 Saul said, “They have brought them from the Amalekites, for the people spared the best of the sheep and oxen, to sacrifice to the LORD your God; but the rest we have utterly destroyed.”
- 16 Then Samuel said to Saul, “Wait, and let me tell you what the LORD said to me last night.” And he said to him, “Speak!”
- 17 Samuel said, “Is it not true, though you were little in your own eyes, you were *made* the head of the tribes of Israel? And the LORD anointed you king over Israel,
- 18 and the LORD sent you on a mission, and said, ‘Go and utterly destroy the sinners, the Amalekites, and fight against them until they are exterminated.’
- 19 “Why then did you not obey the voice of the LORD, but rushed upon the spoil and did what was evil in the sight of the LORD?”
- 20 Then Saul said to Samuel, “I did obey the voice of the LORD, and went on the mission on which the LORD sent me, and have brought back Agag the king of Amalek, and have utterly destroyed the Amalekites.

DAY FIVE

Genesis 27:39 Then Isaac his father answered and said to him,
“Behold, away from the fertility of the earth shall be your dwelling,
And away from the dew of heaven from above.

Numbers 20:14-21

- 14 From Kadesh Moses then sent messengers to the king of Edom: “Thus your brother Israel has said, ‘You know all the hardship that has befallen us;
- 15 that our fathers went down to Egypt, and we stayed in Egypt a long time, and the Egyptians treated us and our fathers badly.
- 16 ‘But when we cried out to the LORD, He heard our voice and sent an angel and brought us out from Egypt; now behold, we are at Kadesh, a town on the edge of your territory.
- 17 ‘Please let us pass through your land. We will not pass through field or through vineyard; we will not even drink water from a well. We will go along the king’s highway, not turning to the right or left, until we pass through your territory.’ ”
- 18 Edom, however, said to him, “You shall not pass through us, or I will come out with the sword against you.”
- 19 Again, the sons of Israel said to him, “We will go up by the highway, and if I and my

- livestock do drink any of your water, then I will pay its price. Let me only pass through on my feet, nothing *else*.”
- 20 But he said, “You shall not pass through.” And Edom came out against him with a heavy force and with a strong hand.
- 21 Thus Edom refused to allow Israel to pass through his territory; so Israel turned away from him.

Numbers 34:1-3

- 1 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying,
- 2 “Command the sons of Israel and say to them, ‘When you enter the land of Canaan, this is the land that shall fall to you as an inheritance, *even the* land of Canaan according to its borders.
- 3 ‘Your southern sector shall extend from the wilderness of Zin along the side of Edom, and your southern border shall extend from the end of the Salt Sea eastward.

Joshua 24:3-4

- 3 ‘Then I took your father Abraham from beyond the River, and led him through all the land of Canaan, and multiplied his descendants and gave him Isaac.
- 4 ‘To Isaac I gave Jacob and Esau, and to Esau I gave Mount Seir to possess it; but Jacob and his sons went down to Egypt.

Obadiah 1:1-21

- 1 The vision of Obadiah.
Thus says the Lord GOD concerning Edom—
We have heard a report from the LORD,
And an envoy has been sent among the nations *saying*,
“Arise and let us go against her for battle”—
- 2 “Behold, I will make you small among the nations;
You are greatly despised.
- 3 “The arrogance of your heart has deceived you,
You who live in the clefts of the rock,
In the loftiness of your dwelling place,
Who say in your heart,
‘Who will bring me down to earth?’
- 4 “Though you build high like the eagle,
Though you set your nest among the stars,
From there I will bring you down,” declares the LORD.
- 5 “If thieves came to you,
If robbers by night—
O how you will be ruined!—
Would they not steal *only* until they had enough?
If grape gatherers came to you,
Would they not leave *some* gleanings?
- 6 “O how Esau will be ransacked,
And his hidden treasures searched out!
- 7 “All the men allied with you
Will send you forth to the border,
And the men at peace with you
Will deceive you and overpower you.
They who eat your bread

Will set an ambush for you.
 (There is no understanding in him.)

8 “Will I not on that day,” declares the LORD,
 “Destroy wise men from Edom
 And understanding from the mountain of Esau?

9 “Then your mighty men will be dismayed, O Teman,
 So that everyone may be cut off from the mountain of Esau by slaughter.

10 “Because of violence to your brother Jacob,
 You will be covered *with* shame,
 And you will be cut off forever.

11 “On the day that you stood aloof,
 On the day that strangers carried off his wealth,
 And foreigners entered his gate
 And cast lots for Jerusalem—
 You too were as one of them.

12 “Do not gloat over your brother’s day,
 The day of his misfortune.
 And do not rejoice over the sons of Judah
 In the day of their destruction;
 Yes, do not boast
 In the day of *their* distress.

13 “Do not enter the gate of My people
 In the day of their disaster.
 Yes, you, do not gloat over their calamity
 In the day of their disaster.
 And do not loot their wealth
 In the day of their disaster.

14 “Do not stand at the fork of the road
 To cut down their fugitives;
 And do not imprison their survivors
 In the day of their distress.

15 “For the day of the LORD draws near on all the nations.
 As you have done, it will be done to you.
 Your dealings will return on your own head.

16 “Because just as you drank on My holy mountain,
 All the nations will drink continually.
 They will drink and swallow
 And become as if they had never existed.

17 “But on Mount Zion there will be those who escape,
 And it will be holy.
 And the house of Jacob will possess their possessions.

18 “Then the house of Jacob will be a fire
 And the house of Joseph a flame;
 But the house of Esau *will be* as stubble.
 And they will set them on fire and consume them,
 So that there will be no survivor of the house of Esau,”
 For the LORD has spoken.

19 Then *those of* the Negev will possess the mountain of Esau,

And *those of* the Shephelah the Philistine *plain*;
 Also, possess the territory of Ephraim and the territory of Samaria,
 And Benjamin *will possess* Gilead.
 20 And the exiles of this host of the sons of Israel,
 Who are *among* the Canaanites as far as Zarephath,
 And the exiles of Jerusalem who are in Sepharad
 Will possess the cities of the Negev.
 21 The deliverers will ascend Mount Zion
 To judge the mountain of Esau,
 And the kingdom will be the LORD'S.

Malachi 1:1-5

1 The oracle of the word of the LORD to Israel through Malachi.
 2 "I have loved you," says the LORD. But you say, "How have You loved us?" "*Was* not
 Esau Jacob's brother?" declares the LORD. "Yet I have loved Jacob;
 3 but I have hated Esau, and I have made his mountains a desolation and *appointed* his
 inheritance for the jackals of the wilderness."
 4 Though Edom says, "We have been beaten down, but we will return and build up the
 ruins"; thus says the LORD of hosts, "They may build, but I will tear down; and *men* will
 call them the wicked territory, and the people toward whom the LORD is indignant
 forever."
 5 Your eyes will see this and you will say, "The LORD be magnified beyond the border of
 Israel!"

Daniel 11:40-41

40 "At the end time the king of the South will collide with him, and the king of the North will
 storm against him with chariots, with horsemen and with many ships; and he will enter
 countries, overflow *them* and pass through.
 41 "He will also enter the Beautiful Land, and many *countries* will fall; but these will be
 rescued out of his hand: Edom, Moab and the foremost of the sons of Ammon.

Jeremiah 49:7-22

7 Concerning Edom.
 Thus says the LORD of hosts,
 "Is there no longer any wisdom in Teman?
 Has good counsel been lost to the prudent?
 Has their wisdom decayed?
 8 "Flee away, turn back, dwell in the depths,
 O inhabitants of Dedan,
 For I will bring the disaster of Esau upon him
 At the time I punish him.
 9 "If grape gatherers came to you,
 Would they not leave gleanings?
 If thieves *came* by night,
 They would destroy *only* until they had enough.
 10 "But I have stripped Esau bare,
 I have uncovered his hiding places
 So that he will not be able to conceal himself;
 His offspring has been destroyed along with his relatives
 And his neighbors, and he is no more.

- 11 “Leave your orphans behind, I will keep *them* alive;
And let your widows trust in Me.”
- 12 For thus says the LORD, “Behold, those who were not sentenced to drink the cup will certainly drink *it*, and are you the one who will be completely acquitted? You will not be acquitted, but you will certainly drink *it*.”
- 13 “For I have sworn by Myself,” declares the LORD, “that Bozrah will become an object of horror, a reproach, a ruin and a curse; and all its cities will become perpetual ruins.”
- 14 I have heard a message from the LORD,
And an envoy is sent among the nations, *saying*,
“Gather yourselves together and come against her,
And rise up for battle!”
- 15 “For behold, I have made you small among the nations,
Despised among men.
- 16 “As for the terror of you,
The arrogance of your heart has deceived you,
O you who live in the clefts of the rock,
Who occupy the height of the hill.
Though you make your nest as high as an eagle’s,
I will bring you down from there,” declares the LORD.
- 17 “Edom will become an object of horror; everyone who passes by it will be horrified and will hiss at all its wounds.
- 18 “Like the overthrow of Sodom and Gomorrah with its neighbors,” says the LORD, “no one will live there, nor will a son of man reside in it.
- 19 “Behold, one will come up like a lion from the thickets of the Jordan against a perennially watered pasture; for in an instant I will make him run away from it, and whoever is chosen I shall appoint over it. For who is like Me, and who will summon Me *into court*? And who then is the shepherd who can stand against Me?”
- 20 Therefore hear the plan of the LORD which He has planned against Edom, and His purposes which He has purposed against the inhabitants of Teman: surely they will drag them off, *even* the little ones of the flock; surely He will make their pasture desolate because of them.
- 21 The earth has quaked at the noise of their downfall. There is an outcry! The noise of it has been heard at the Red Sea.
- 22 Behold, He will mount up and swoop like an eagle and spread out His wings against Bozrah; and the hearts of the mighty men of Edom in that day will be like the heart of a woman in labor.

Ezekiel 25:12-14

- 12 ‘Thus says the Lord GOD, “Because Edom has acted against the house of Judah by taking vengeance, and has incurred grievous guilt, and avenged themselves upon them,”
- 13 therefore thus says the Lord GOD, “I will also stretch out My hand against Edom and cut off man and beast from it. And I will lay it waste; from Teman even to Dedan they will fall by the sword.
- 14 “I will lay My vengeance on Edom by the hand of My people Israel. Therefore, they will act in Edom according to My anger and according to My wrath; thus they will know My vengeance,” declares the Lord GOD.

Isaiah 34:1-17

- 1 Draw near, O nations, to hear; and listen, O peoples!
Let the earth and all it contains hear, and the world and all that springs from it.

2 For the LORD's indignation is against all the nations,
 And *His* wrath against all their armies;
 He has utterly destroyed them,
 He has given them over to slaughter.
 3 So their slain will be thrown out,
 And their corpses will give off their stench,
 And the mountains will be drenched with their blood.
 4 And all the host of heaven will wear away,
 And the sky will be rolled up like a scroll;
 All their hosts will also wither away
 As a leaf withers from the vine,
 Or as *one* withers from the fig tree.
 5 For My sword is satiated in heaven,
 Behold it shall descend for judgment upon Edom
 And upon the people whom I have devoted to destruction.
 6 The sword of the LORD is filled with blood,
 It is sated with fat, with the blood of lambs and goats,
 With the fat of the kidneys of rams.
 For the LORD has a sacrifice in Bozrah
 And a great slaughter in the land of Edom.
 7 Wild oxen will also fall with them
 And young bulls with strong ones;
 Thus their land will be soaked with blood,
 And their dust become greasy with fat.
 8 For the LORD has a day of vengeance,
 A year of recompense for the cause of Zion.
 9 Its streams will be turned into pitch,
 And its loose earth into brimstone,
 And its land will become burning pitch.
 10 It will not be quenched night or day;
 Its smoke will go up forever.
 From generation to generation it will be desolate;
 None will pass through it forever and ever.
 11 But pelican and hedgehog will possess it,
 And owl and raven will dwell in it;
 And He will stretch over it the line of desolation
 And the plumb line of emptiness.
 12 Its nobles—there is no one there
Whom they may proclaim king—
 And all its princes will be nothing.
 13 Thorns will come up in its fortified towers,
 Nettles and thistles in its fortified cities;
 It will also be a haunt of jackals
And an abode of ostriches.
 14 The desert creatures will meet with the wolves,
 The hairy goat also will cry to its kind;
 Yes, the night monster will settle there
 And will find herself a resting place.
 15 The tree snake will make its nest and lay *eggs* there,
 And it will hatch and gather *them* under its protection.

- Yes, the hawks will be gathered there,
Every one with its kind.
- 16 Seek from the book of the LORD, and read:
Not one of these will be missing;
None will lack its mate.
For His mouth has commanded,
And His Spirit has gathered them.
- 17 He has cast the lot for them,
And His hand has divided it to them by line.
They shall possess it forever;
From generation to generation they will dwell in it.

Amos 1:6-8, 11-12

- 6 Thus says the LORD,
“For three transgressions of Gaza and for four
I will not revoke its *punishment*,
Because they deported an entire population
To deliver *it* up to Edom.
- 7 “So I will send fire upon the wall of Gaza
And it will consume her citadels.
- 8 “I will also cut off the inhabitant from Ashdod,
And him who holds the scepter, from Ashkelon;
I will even unleash My power upon Ekron,
And the remnant of the Philistines will perish,”
Says the Lord GOD.
- 11 Thus says the LORD,
“For three transgressions of Edom and for four
I will not revoke its *punishment*,
Because he pursued his brother with the sword,
While he stifled his compassion;
His anger also tore continually,
And he maintained his fury forever.

Ezekiel 35:1-15

- 1 Moreover, the word of the LORD came to me saying,
2 “Son of man, set your face against Mount Seir, and prophesy against it
3 and say to it, ‘Thus says the Lord GOD,
“Behold, I am against you, Mount Seir,
And I will stretch out My hand against you
And make you a desolation and a waste.
- 4 “I will lay waste your cities
And you will become a desolation.
Then you will know that I am the LORD.
- 5 “Because you have had everlasting enmity and have delivered the sons of Israel to the
power of the sword at the time of their calamity, at the time of the punishment of the end,
6 therefore as I live,” declares the Lord GOD, “I will give you over to bloodshed, and
bloodshed will pursue you; since you have not hated bloodshed, therefore bloodshed will
pursue you.

- 7 “I will make Mount Seir a waste and a desolation and I will cut off from it the one who passes through and returns.
- 8 “I will fill its mountains with its slain; on your hills and in your valleys and in all your ravines those slain by the sword will fall.
- 9 “I will make you an everlasting desolation and your cities will not be inhabited. Then you will know that I am the LORD.
- 10 “Because you have said, ‘These two nations and these two lands will be mine, and we will possess them,’ although the LORD was there,
- 11 therefore as I live,” declares the Lord GOD, “I will deal *with you* according to your anger and according to your envy which you showed because of your hatred against them; so I will make Myself known among them when I judge you.
- 12 “Then you will know that I, the LORD, have heard all your revilings which you have spoken against the mountains of Israel saying, ‘They are laid desolate; they are given to us for food.’
- 13 “And you have spoken arrogantly against Me and have multiplied your words against Me; I have heard *it*.”
- 14 ‘Thus says the Lord GOD, “As all the earth rejoices, I will make you a desolation.
- 15 “As you rejoiced over the inheritance of the house of Israel because it was desolate, so I will do to you. You will be a desolation, O Mount Seir, and all Edom, all of it. Then they will know that I am the LORD.” ’

Isaiah 63:1-6

- 1 Who is this who comes from Edom,
With garments of glowing colors from Bozrah,
This One who is majestic in His apparel,
Marching in the greatness of His strength?
“It is I who speak in righteousness, mighty to save.”
- 2 Why is Your apparel red,
And Your garments like the one who treads in the wine press?
- 3 “I have trodden the wine trough alone,
And from the peoples there was no man with Me.
I also trod them in My anger
And trampled them in My wrath;
And their lifeblood is sprinkled on My garments,
And I stained all My raiment.
- 4 “For the day of vengeance was in My heart,
