DAY ONE

Q2. From the requests to greet various people, what insight do you gain about Paul

The capital city of Rome was a magnet that drew people from all over the empire. In addition Paul's travels to many of the major population centers—Jerusalem, Syrian Antioch, Philippi, Athens, Corinth, Ephesus—brought him into contact with the mobile segment of Roman society. These factors help explain the presence of Paul's many friends in Rome, but his knowledge of their whereabouts remains a tribute to his deep concern for people.²

- 1-2 **Phoebe** servant of the church; has been a helper of many, and of myself as well.
- 3-4 Prisca and Aquila (Acts 18:2ff) fellow workers in Christ Jesus, for my life risked their necks;
- 5 **Epaenetus** my *beloved, first convert to Christ from Asia
- 6 Mary has worked hard for you
- 7 Andronicus & Junias my *kinsmen & fellow prisoners, outstanding, in Christ before me
- 8 **Ampliatus** my beloved in Christ
- 9 Urbanus our fellow worker in Christ...Stachys my *beloved
- 10 Apelles the approved in Christ; (approved through testing) those of the household of Aristobulus
- 11 **Herodion** *kinsman; the household of Narcissus, who are in the Lord (division in the household?)
- 12 Tryphaena & Tryphosa (sisters?) workers in the Lord

Persis – the *beloved, has worked hard in the Lord

13 **Rufus** – a choice man in the Lord, his mother and mine.

The greeting included Rufus' **mother who**, Paul said, had also **been a mother to** him. Paul obviously did not say she was his actual mother, but he had been the recipient of her motherly care.²

- 14 Aysbcritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas, the brethren with them (a house church?)
- 15 Philologus & Julia, Nereus & his sister, Olympas, all the saints with them (a house church?)

DAY TWO

- **Q2.** What warnings, admonitions and commands does Paul give in this chapter?
- 1 I commend to you our sister Phoebe...2 **receive her** in the Lord in a manner worthy of the saints and that you **help her** in whatever matter she may have need of you...
- 17 I urge you...keep your eye on (mark, notice carefully) those who cause dissensions and hindrances (occasions for stumbling) contrary to the teaching which you learned and turn away from them
- **18** for such men are slaves

not of our Lord Christ, but of their own appetites and

by their smooth and flattering speech they deceive the hearts of the unsuspecting.

- 19...I want you to be wise in what is good and innocent in what is evil.
- **Q3.** If Paul were writing to LifeSpring Church and sent you a word of greeting, how would he describe you? ...beloved, hard worker, fellow worker in Christ, a choice man (woman) in the Lord
- **Q4.** "Greet one another with a holy kiss." What does Paul mean by this?

The continuance of this Oriental Christian custom of connecting the salutation and the kiss as an expression of fellowship and of common festivals, is known in the Greek church (Luke 7:45).¹

^{*}Kinsman – could mean a Jew or of the tribe of Benjamin, not necessarily of his personal family.

d. How far has this gospel gone?

Made know to all the nations

e. What is the mystery?

Jews and Gentiles in one body People of **all nations might believe and obey** Christ (Romans 1:5; 15:18; 1 Peter 1:2). Paul's concern for the geographical spread of the gospel is evident here (Matt. 28:19), appropriate in view of his writing to the believers at the empire's capital city.²
